

## Life Group Discussion Questions

### Kingdom Citizen Orientation – March 8, 2020

1. In Matthew 5:17, Jesus says “Do not think I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them. What does this convey about the importance of the Law for Jews and for us today?
2. Jesus teaches that the moral standard for Kingdom citizens is higher than that of people in the world. Why should this be the case for God’s people? Why wouldn’t it be enough to conform to the moral code of the nation in which we live?
3. Often, I hear Christians say, “I’m not a doormat.” By that, they mean, I’m not just going to be walked on. In Matthew 5:38-42, Jesus speaks about being a doormat. What is Jesus trying to teach his disciples in this passage?
4. What areas of your life do you struggle to give God complete control? Why is it hard to let God rule supreme in this area of your life? How can you grow in giving this over to God?
